Cristiano Pesaresi is Associate Professor of Geography at the Sapienza University of Rome and he is qualified as Full Professor M-GGR/01 – Geography at National Scientific Abilitation (DD No. 1532/2016). He teaches "GIS applications and geographical methodology" and "General geography".

He is President of the Degree Course in "Geographical Sciences for Environment and Health" of the Sapienza University of Rome since November 2015. He is Scientific Responsible of the GeoCartographic Laboratory of the Sapienza University of Rome since April 2014. He is Coordinator of the syllabus in "Geographical studies" of the research Doctorate in "Documentation studies, Linguistics and Literature" since May 2017.

He has been Responsible for the Quality Commission of the Degree course in "Management and valorisation of the territory" at the Sapienza University of Rome, and he is Member of the Quality Commission of the degree course in "Geographic sciences for the environment and health", at the same University.

Since June 2018 he is Editor in Chief of "J-READING - Journal of Research and Didactics in Geography"; he is Referee, Member of the Scientific Committee and of the Editorial board of many international and "Class A" scientific journals.

He has been Scientific Responsible of many research grant and research projects. He has been speaker and chairman at about 70 meetings, seminars and national and international conferences, and has taken part in the organisation of about 35 events at national and international level. He has also organised numerous third mission activities.

Since September 2014 he is National Advisor of the Italian Association of Geography Teachers (AIIG), of which is has been "Website and geotechnologies manager", and since April 2010 he is Vice President of the provincial Section of AIIG Rome. Since September 2016, he is Contact for Italy of the Commission on Geographical Education (CGE) of the International Geographical Union (IGU).



In 2016 he was Winner of the "Società Geografica Italiana" Award and recipient of a plaque from the President of the Republic. In 2012 he was Winner of a selection among under-40 Researchers of the Faculty of "Filosofia, Lettere, Scienze Umanistiche, Studi Orientali", Sapienza University of Rome, for curriculum and project. In 2014 he was Appointed for High scientific profile (art. 4 of the Regulation), upon nomination by the Academic Senate of 1st July 2014, contact for the Macro Area E of the Sapienza University of Rome in the Commission for the allocation to professors and researchers of the incentive referred to in art. 29, para. 19, of act 240/10.
