She teaches Physical Geography of the Continents, Regional Geoecology of Europe, Natural Zones of the World and other disciplines for bachelor and master students. She is also a lecturer at the School of Young Geographers and at the Preparatory Courses of the MSU Faculty of Geography. Together with colleagues she is engaged in research projects of the department dealing with the analysis of regional geoecological issues under the global environmental changes. She has participated in a number of research grants. She was speaker at about 20 meetings and national and international conferences. She is author of about 70 scientific publications.

Since 2011 Marina Arshinova is a member of the Russian Geographic Society. In 2005 she was awarded the Badge of Honor to the 250 Anniversary of the Lomonosov Moscow State University.
