ACADEMIC CAREER

Victoria Ross Bailes graduated in Languages and Philosophy at the University of Edinburgh in 1975.

She retired in 2022 after a long career teaching English language and technical English in the Faculty of Law (LM1), Social Sciences, Political Science (L36) and Languages for Mediation and Communication (L12) at the LUMSA University of Rome.

At the Sapienza University of Rome she recently taught a course for PhD students in Engineering and Architecture, tackling subjects pertaining to their research.

In the past she also taught at the Scuola Ufficiali Carabinieri and the Scuola Sottufficiali in Rome for the Centro Linguistico. During the same period, she was involved in organising courses at the Chamber of Deputies and the Senate for top officers and MPs, in the position of Director of Studies for a language school in Rome.

Her teaching then took her to give lessons at Antitrust, the Italian watchdog, also RAI International and the Salesian University in Rome.

She has been a member of the commissions of various public competitions, from the SSPS, the Superior School of the Public Administration to the SLE, Scuola di Lingue Estere dell'Esercito.

At present her main occupation is proofreading and translating academic papers and drafts for publication nationally and internationally on different subjects ranging from Public Law, Philosophy of Law, Geography and Didactics, subtitles for films and filmscripts, juridical analysis, Bioethics and Biojuridics, Ancient history, Global and glocal phenomena, Economics and law, Political Science, Sociology etc.

She has translated four books and written one of her own which is awaiting publication.
